THE TCPA'S MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION RATES

1. Context

As set out in the governing documents, changes to the membership subscription rates need to be agreed by the Association at its AGM.

It was agreed at the 2024 AGM that membership subscription rates should become a standing item on the AGM agenda with increases in line with inflation being proposed unless there were extenuating circumstances [see section 10 of agenda item 2 – Draft minutes from the 2024 AGM].

The paper that informed the discussion in 2024, states that it was expected that inflation would be based on Consumer Prices Index (CPI) for May of each year. This figure is usually published by the Office for National Statistics in mid-June and would therefore be available in time for the AGM, which is usually held in July.

CPI in May 2025, as publuished by the Office of National Statistics on 18 June, was 3.4%.

The impact of a 3.4% increase on current rates is set out in figure 1.

If agreed, for practical reasons, these increases would be applied from 1 October 2025 and then to all subscription renewals as they arise on a monthly rolling basis.
